# **Our vision** is that healthcare decisionmaking throughout the world will be informed by high-quality, timely research evidence."

The Cochrane Collaboration is an international network of more than 28,000 dedicated people from <u>over 100 countries</u>. We work together to help healthcare practitioners, policy-makers, patients, their advocates and carers, make well-informed decisions about health care, by preparing, updating, and promoting the accessibility of <u>Cochrane Reviews</u> – over 5,000 so far, published online in the *Cochrane Database of Systematic Reviews*, part of *The Cochrane Library*. We also prepare the largest collection of records of randomised controlled trials in the world, called CENTRAL, published as part of *The Cochrane Library*.

Our work is internationally recognised as the benchmark for high quality information about the effectiveness of health care.

# We believe in equal partnerships

The Collaboration believes that effective health care is created through equal partnerships between researcher, provider, practitioner and patient.

Cochrane Reviews are unique because they are both produced by, and are relevant to, everyone interested in the effects of human health care. Based on the best available evidence, healthcare providers can decide if they should fund production of a particular drug. Practitioners can find out if an intervention is effective in a specific clinical context. Patients and other healthcare consumers can assess the potential risks and benefits of their treatment.

The Cochrane Collaboration's contributors are a mix of volunteers and paid staff who are affiliated to the organisation through Cochrane *entities*: healthcare subject-related review groups, thematic networks (called 'fields'), groups concerned with the methodology of systematic reviews, and regional centres.

Many are world leaders in their field of medicine, health policy, research methodology or consumer advocacy, and our entities are situated in some of the world's finest academic and medical institutions.

#### We are independent

The Cochrane Collaboration is named after Archie Cochrane (1909-1988), a British epidemiologist, who advocated the use of randomised controlled trials as a means of reliably informing healthcare practice. We are an independent, not-for-profit organisation, funded by a variety of sources including governments, universities, hospital trusts, charities and personal donations.

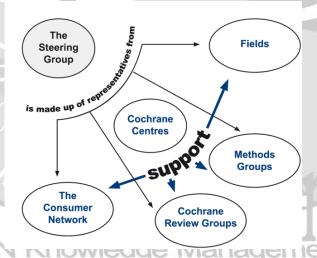

# We are democratically led



The Collaboration is registered as a charity in the United Kingdom. To tie the organisation together, we have a number of overarching structures, led by the Steering Group, which provides policy and strategic leadership for the organisation. Members of this group are democratically elected from, and by, our contributors.

We also have a Cochrane Operations Unit, based in Oxford, UK, which manages the financial, legal and administrative work of the organisation, led by the Chief Executive Officer of the Collaboration; and a CochraneEditorial Unit, based in London, UK, which

supports Cochrane Review production, editorial processes, and training and methods development, le Editor in Chief of *The Cochrane Library*.
